THE NEED:

- According to a recent Harvard study, Winston-Salem is the hardest city in the United States for children to escape childhood poverty.
- 1/3 of all children in Winston-Salem live in poverty; Winston-Salem is 20th in the nation for highest childhood poverty rates according to a survey in the Triad Business Journal – 06/2019.
- 3rd Grade Literacy is the number one determinant of whether a child will graduate from high school. In 2019, only 26.4% of 3rd grade students at Old Town Elementary School passed the End of Grade (EOG) Tests for reading.
- The effects of Covid-19 and the subsequent closing of schools will be devasting to students and their educational proficiency for years to come.
